INTRODUCTION

This catalogue contains series of matchboxlabels and skillets that have been issued in the Netherlands since Worldwar II. It is only a small part of all the labels and skillets that are issued in the Netherlands since the first matches were sold.

The history of matchfactories in the Netherlands started around 1870. Over the years some new factories were founded and other factories merged. Most of these factories were closed between both worldware.

were closed between both worldwars.
After Worldwar II 3 factories still existed. In Eindhoven and Breda were two factories who formed the 'V.H.L.F. which stood for 'Verenigde Hollandsche Lucifers-Fabrieken' meaning 'United Dutch Matchfactories', part of Swedish Match.
In Weert stood the 'Nationale lucifersfabriek' (national matchfactory).
In 1967 the 'V.H.L.F.' took over the factory in Weert, and at the same time they closed the factory and also the one in Breda. Since then only the factory in Eindhoven was left. As a result of a reorganisation of the Swedish Match factories in Europe the last Dutch factory finally closed in 1980. The matchproduction moved to the Belgian UNAL factory in Geraardsbergen.

Since 1881 there is also a trading-company in Amsterdam, called 'Attema'. First they traded Swedish matches, later they also became the selling-agent for the 'V.H.L.F.'.

Another trading-company, specialized in publicity-matches is 'Atria'. In 1968 they became part of the Attema trading Co. Nowadays Atria is specialized in booklets and luxury publicity boxes.

In April 1991 the names of Attema and Atria have officially changed into 'Swedish Match Nederland b.v.'.

The amount of Dutch labels and skillets is enormous. From 1870 to 1945 it were mostly brand-labels, in a lot of varieties and most of them with packetlabels. Alot of Dutch brands have been exported and some of them are only issued abroad. In these years publicity-matches were not common and only a few sets were issued. Alot of pre-war labels have been documented, but undoubtedly some labels do not exist anymore and therefore will never be found.

After Worldwar II the economy was growing fast and soon the matchfactories started producing labels in various colours and the issuing of sets started. In the Netherlands it was a chain of grocers-shops who first issued sets, and soon others followed, and the factories also began printing their own sets. As a result of this people discovered that the matchbox was an excellent publicity-article and therefore an enormous amount of publicity-labels have been issued over the years, not only to promote articles or companies, but also to prevent the use of alcohol, to raise money for clubs or good causes, or labels with the name of a restaurant or tobacconist. And besides the sets most grocers-shops and supermarkets have also issued lots of single labels or skillets and even nowadays every year some new ones are issued.

The first sets issued after Worldwar II were made by the Dutch factories. In the 1970's some supermarkets started importing their matches from countries like Belgium, Hungary or Yugoslavia because they were cheaper. And of course since 1980 all matches sold in the Netherlands are made abroad.

In this catalogue are the sets that were generally available all over the country. This means the sets issued by the factories (mostly sold in 'independant' grocersshops), the sets issued by the grocers-shops and supermarkets (with their own names on it) and a few sets of publicity-labels and -skillets.

With each set I've mentioned the Dutch title of the set (in capital, underlined letters), the factory or country who produced the matches, and the subject of the set. If the set is numbered only one label in printed plus the packetlabel. Where necessary the complete set is printed. There is also an indication which labels are horizontal and which are vertical, and there is a discription of the colours. Finally with some sets there is a brief description of the subject or a few translations of text on the labels or a little background information.

Undoubtedly there will be some language-mistakes but I hope they won't be too annoying and this catalogue nevertheless will help collectors outside the Netherlands to organize their collection of Dutch labels and skillets and that it will encourage others to start collecting them.

All information in this catalogue is taken from catalogues and magazines from the 'studie- en documentatiegroep lucifersetiketten van de Ned. ver. De Verzamelaar', the Dutch society of collectors of matchboxlabels, -skillets and/or booklets.

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ATTEMA

Mr. J.W.Attema started in 1881 a trading-company in Amsterdam which soon was used by Swedish matchfactories as agent for selling matches in the Netherlands. One of the first brands they sold was 'zwaluw' (the swallow) which is still for sale in the Netherlands. Later on Attema also became agent for Dutch factories.

AL/LUCIMIX

Attema started issuing series in 1960 with the name 'AL', which stood for 'Automaat-Lucifers' (automation-matches from a machine like stamps or cigarettes). Later the matches were sold in stores and from that moment 'AL' stood for 'Attema-Lucifers'.


In 1979 the last Dutch matchfactory in Eindhoven was closed down and Attema stoppedissuing series. But in 1985 they issued a new series using the old brandname 'LUCIMIX'. The matches were made in Sweden.

These boxes had a new size that never had been used before in the Netherlands (47x58 mm). They were packed in cellophane and a pack contained only 5 boxes.





The 2nd. set has been issued on shiny, greyish-white paper and on shiny, bright-white paper.

The labels are multi-coloured with black text. The band at the bottom is yellow (1st. and 3rd.set) or green (2nd.set).

G.G. was the name of the grocers-shops which issued the stamps. It stood for 'Gezond Gezin' (healthy family), but on the labels it meant 'Groeiend Geld' (growing money). 'vervult wensen' means 'makes wishes come true'.

4th. set,1976 20 labels, nrs.61-80 + 1 packetlabel

This set is different from the other 3 sets. The labels have white text on a black background (printed on shiny paper).

In 1982 a reprint of the 4th.set was issued on thin, matt paper, These were made by Union Match in Belgium.













ATRIA

Atria is another trading-company that started in 1934 and they were specialized in publicity-matches. In 1968 they became part of the Attema trading Co.

Until 1980 they issued a lot of labels for companies, products, hotels/restaurants, to bacconists, and so on. Nowadays they only issue booklets and luxury-boxes (with just one abrasive-section and in various measures).

In the years before 1968 they registered 8 trade-marks named after planets, which they later used for a set.

PLANETEN Eindhoven,1961 SUBJECT: planets.

8 unnumbered labels + 2 packetlabels.

The 8 planets are: Jupiter Pluto Mars Saturnus Mercurius Uranus Neptunus Venus

The 2 packetlabels: 'Saturnus' 'Planeten-serie'

In 1971 a reprint of the set was issued. The letters 1 and f from 'lucifers' are longer. This set has only 1 packetlabel: 'planeten-serie'.

In 1973 the 2nd. set was reprinted on shiny paper.

On all the labels stands 'lucifers voor rokers' which means 'matches for smokers'. These matches were not for sale in shops but per box for sale or given free at tobacconists. The planets are printed green on a blue background. The text is printed in white.







GEJO

GEJO stand for 'General Export JOegoslavië' and is a trading-company who import all kinds of goods from Yugoslavia.

In the late 1970's they imported matches from the DRAVA factory in Osijek and sold them in Dutch stores. It was a set of 24 numbered labels with dogs. printed on a blue background, with black surfaces at the right and at the bottom and white borders. The flame above 'DRAVA' is red. Later they issued the same set, but with their own name:

The colours are like the set mentioned above. 'gejo venlo' printed black with a red flame.

In 1980 the set was reprinted on thin, matt paper. These were for sale for only a very short time.

In 1981 the set again was reprinted. The black band at the right is smaller, and also the white space above 'venlo'. \Box These labels are printed on shiny paper.

MOLEN

Molen was the most famous brand of the V.H.L.F. factory in Eindhoven. The brand was registered in 1890 and over the years a lot of single labels have been issued (with packetlabels) and also a few household-boxes. They started issueing series in 1959.



The packetlabel exists in 2 sizes. The first one is 69×83 mm, which is only available in mint condition. It has only been used with the white borders cut off. In 1962 it has been reprinted in a smaller size (67×78 mm). numbers 2,11,13,21,23,30,32,38,39,49,55,58,61 and67 are horizontal, all others vertical.

Every number has a letter that indicates the kind of product. These letters are:

numbers 10-14 V for Voedsel (food)
numbers 15-19 C for Chemie (chemistry)
numbers 20-22 T for Textiel (textile)
numbers 23-24 L for Leer (leather)
numbers 25-26 H for Hout (wood)
numbers 27-28 A for Aardewerk (earthenware)
number 29-30 P for Papier (paper)
number 31 D for Diamanten (diamonds)
number 32 MB for MijnBouw (mining).



In 1979 there were rumours that the factory in Eindhoven would be closed. Around that time this set was issued. The fact that it are skillets instead of labels proved that they were not printed in the Netherlands.

When the set was first issued it had a packetlabel with 'NED.FAB.' which stands for 'Nederlands Fabrikaat' (made in the Netherlands). Later the set was sold packed in cellophane without a packetlabel. This meant that now the matches were also foreign made, namely by Union Match in Geraardsbergen, Belgium.

The backside of the skillets is dark-blue, the abrasive-section has horizontal and vertical lines.


When finally the Dutch factory was closed, the issuing of new windmill sets stopped. After four years a new set was issued, but with a totally different design. Again they were made by Union Match, Belgium. and packed in cellophane.

The backside of the skillets is light-blue, the abrasive-section has diagonal lines.

Again a complete new design and a new boxsize (47 x 58 mm). Packed in cellophane with one pack containing only 5 boxes. Made by Union Match, Belgium.

VLINDER

This was the most famous brand from the Nationale Lucifers Fabriek (National Match Factory) in Weert. The factory started in 1936 and in 1968 it became part of the V.H.L.F. company and it was closed in 1969.

Of this brand also, like 'molen' a lot of single labels have been issued.





GROCERS-SHOPS/SUPERMARKETS

The following series have been issued by chains of grocers-shops and supermarkets using their own names.

In the 1950s 'centra' started issuing series and soon lots of others followed. At that time they were all still small grocers-shops.

In the 1960s and 1970s some of these shops became self-service supermarkets, others were closed. Nowadays only a few of the older chains still exist as supermarkets (Albert Heyn, COOP, EDAH, HEMA, SPAR).

In those years also a lot of new chains were founded, but only a few of them have issued (or still are issuing) series. (Almarkt, ALDImarkt, de Boer, Jan Linders). From all the old grocers-shops and new supermarkets there also are a lot of single labels (with packetlabels) and still every year some new ones are issued.






































































































In 1988 the boxes had no longer labels but the pictures were printed on the skillets.
